*Agreeing*

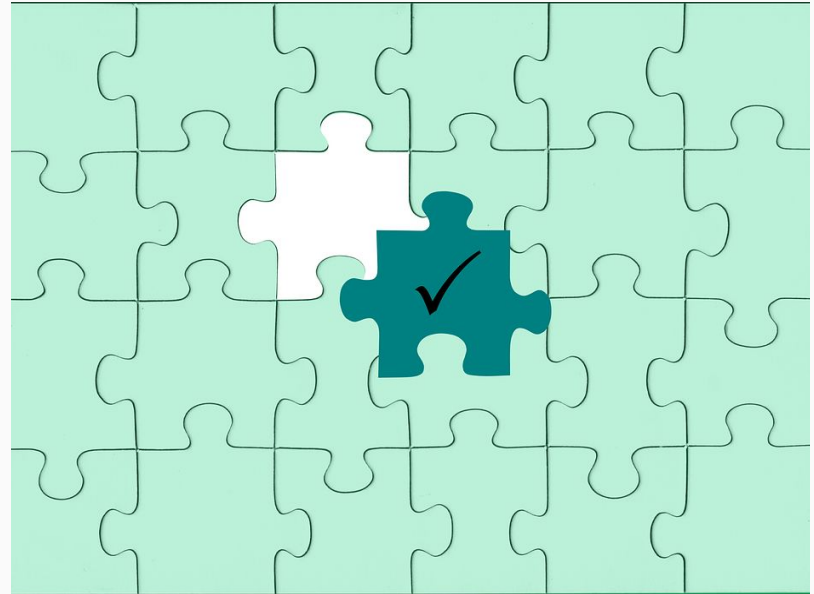
